Christ Our Lord has risen today! Alleluia! This is the day that the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad. Jesus has risen, never to die again. After the anguish of the last few days, it is time to rejoice.

By his resurrection this Easter, Jesus makes a very important statement. That is, he is both the Lord of the living and of the dead. We died with him through our Lenten observances. So, let us also rise with Him through the power of the Holy Spirit. The same power that resurrected him is capable of resurrecting us (Rom 8:11).

This Easter day, we are also all called to join Paul in giving thanks to God: "Who in his great mercy has given us a new birth, by raising Christ from the dead" (Act 2: 42-43). The death of Christ was ours. Also, his resurrection, glory, and triumph are equally ours.

Christ did not put us to shame. Rather, we now have a sure hope in an inheritance that can never be destroyed. So, having been raised with Christ, we must act like the living and not the dead. This is because we share in the new life of Christ.

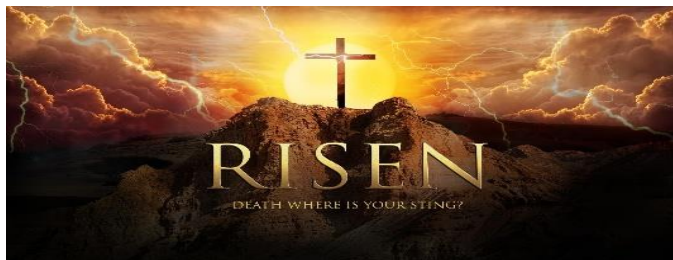
So, now we must seek the things of light, things that are noble, true, just, and things that glorify God. We must seek heavenly things, by living like freed people and citizens of heaven. This is what Paul instructs us to do: "Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, seek the things that are in heaven, where Christ is..."

Through this, Paul calls us to be aware of our new and exalted position in Christ. Let us be happy and rejoice for what God has done for us today in Christ. Let us sing with the Psalmist on this glorious day of Easter: "This day was made by the Lord; we rejoice and are glad.

Finally, let us ask for the grace to enter into the joy of Jesus himself, the seed that fell to the ground and died, and is now, bearing abundant fruit, full of new life.

Alleluia, Alleluia! Peace be with you all!

Christ, our paschal lamb, has been sacrificed;  
let us then feast with joy in the Lord.  
Alleluia, alleluia.

My dear Parishioners,

Our Lent started with the Gospel passage of the temptations of Jesus in the desert that taught us to be faithful to the Father, to his word and his grace; to be faithful to him.

Easter is the celebration of that God of life and Easter is not just celebrated one day. Easter is celebrated for fifty glorious days beginning today culminating on the Solemnity of Pentecost. This is the "mother of all feasts" because we remember the great love of the Father for us, whose Son, Jesus Christ, by dying destroyed death and by rising restored all of us to life.

Easter should also remind us of the beginnings of the Church when the disciples were still hiding at their place for fear of persecution and uncertainty about life, but the Risen Lord was calling them out to meet again in Galilee.

Therefore, this Easter should challenge us to continue what Jesus taught His disciples and to live by His example. It teaches us to take courage that despite the challenges we face in our world, the Risen Christ, through the power of the Holy Spirit, should be more present and active in our lives than ever.

**My prayer for you this Easter is that you live as people deeply touched and healed by the Resurrection and proclaim that: Christ is risen, Alleluia, Alleluia!**

Easter brings hope, joy, and encouragement, focusing on the Resurrection of Jesus as a source of new life and light over darkness and as such I wish you Jesus and pray Jesus will become alive in our lives.

My prayer for you this Easter is that the new life given by Jesus in His Resurrection may burst into the dark 'tombs' of your life".

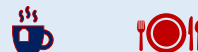
